The promises of God are true



OBJECT:

A seal



What to do:

1. Prepare to show the children the picture of a seal.
2. Ask a question: For example, Do you know what this is? What is it used for?



Read the Bible References:

The Bible references can be read by different children if possible. Or the teacher can read them.



Goals of Lesson:

1. To affirm that the promises of God are true; thus, God can be trusted
2. To enlighten kids on God's promises for them



Lesson Takeaway:

The promises of God are true. God does not lie. He is faithful and I will trust His promises.

Topic:

THE PROMISES OF
GOD ARE TRUE



Bible References:

Genesis 15:1-6;
Genesis 18:13-15;
Genesis 21:1-3.



Notes:

Do you know what a promise is? A promise is a word or an act of commitment to do something. When someone makes a promise to you, they are telling you, “Trust me, I am going to do this for you. Don’t worry at all. I will be true to my word”.

Sometimes, a promise will be written down and a seal or stamp will be placed on it. The seal or stamp makes the promise authentic and real. It tells the person receiving the promise to be calm and confident because anything that has been written down will be done.

The Bible is God’s written word to us. The Bible contains lots of promises from God to us. In fact, some people have counted the promises in the bible and found over 5,000 promises! That’s a lot of promises!

But what is even more exciting about these promises is that God will surely do everything He has promised.

Why should we trust God? We can trust God because:

- i. God is trustworthy. He is reliable and true to His promises – this is God’s very nature (see Numbers 23:19; Titus 1:2).
- ii. God is not a man that can change his mind and make an excuse for not keeping his promise. God does not change (see Malachi 3:6; James 1:17).
- iii. God has the power to fulfil his promises (see Isaiah 55:11; Luke 1:37).
- iv. God is faithful and will keep all his promises (see 1Kings 8:56; Hebrews 10:23).

Do you know you have a role to play before the promises of God can be fulfilled in your life? First, you need to have faith before you can receive the promises of God. You need to believe that God will do what He says He will do (see Hebrews 11:6). Secondly, you need to wait patiently for God. Sometimes, it might look like the promises are taking a long time to happen. Don’t be discouraged, keep waiting because it will happen (see 2 Peter 3:9; Psalm 27:14).

Now, let’s look at some examples of people in the bible who received the promises God made to them.

We read earlier in Genesis 15, how God promised to give Abraham and Sarah a son. It took a long time before their son, Isaac, was born. But Abraham and Sarah waited, and God kept His promise.

In Luke 2:25-32, there was a man named Simeon. God said he would not die until he had seen Baby Jesus. He waited and finally saw Baby Jesus when Joseph and Mary brought Him to the temple.

Do you know any promise that God has made to you? Let’s read some of these promises together:

- i. God says He will give you eternal life – life with God in heaven forever. “And this is the promise that He has promised us—eternal life” (1 John 2:25)

- ii. God says He will always be with you. He will never leave you. “For He Himself has said, “I will never leave you nor forsake you (Hebrews 13:5b).
- iii. God says He will forgive your sins if you ask Him. “If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness” (1 John 1:9).
- iv. The peace of God is always with you. “Peace I leave with you, My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid” (John 14:27).



Memorize:

1 Thessalonians 5:24 - He who calls you is faithful, who also will do it.



Questions:

- i. Mention some promises of God that can be found in the bible.
- ii. Why should you trust the promises of God?



Reminder:

Just like a seal makes a promise authentic, the promises of God are true because God does not lie. He is faithful and I will trust His promises.



Say and repeat:

I will trust the promises of God because God does not tell lies.



Let us pray:

Dear God, thank you because your promises are true. Help me to trust your promises for me in Jesus name, amen.
