### TOPIC:

The blood of Jesus washes away all our sins.



### OBJECT:

Soap and water, washable paint



**What to do:** Get some washable paint. Pour some of the paint in a bowl and ask the children to stain their palms or fingers with the paint. Then, thoroughly wash off the paint from the children using soap and water (be careful to only stain the fingers/palms and not the clothes).

Ask a question: Can you still see the stain of the paint on your palms or fingers?



**Read the Bible References:** The Bible references can be read by different children if possible. Or the teacher can read them.



### Goals of Lesson:

1. To explain that sin stains our hearts.
2. To explain that only the blood of Jesus can wash away the stain of sin.



### Lesson Takeaway:

Sin is like a stain. Only the blood of Jesus can clean the stain of sin.

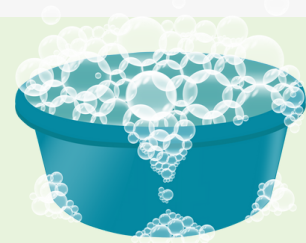

Topic:

THE BLOOD OF JESUS  
WASHES AWAY ALL OUR SINS



Bible References:

1 John 1:7-9



Notes:

When you have a stain on your hands like we saw earlier, you can easily wash off the stain with soap and water. Your hands then become clean as if the stain was never there.

In Genesis 3:1-7, Adam and Eve disobeyed God and committed the first sin. Through them, the nature of sin was passed down to everybody including you and me. So, the first thing I want us to understand is that we were all born as sinners as written in Psalm 51:5 – “Behold, I was brought forth in iniquity, and in sin my mother conceived me”.

Sin is like a stain. It sticks to us and is visible until we wash it off just like that paint. While we can wash off stain from paint by ourselves, we cannot wash off the stain of sin by ourselves. This is what only the blood of Jesus can do.

You see, the stain of sin has caused us to be far away from God. But through the blood of Jesus, we are brought closer and back to fellowship with God. “But now in Christ Jesus you who once were far off have been brought near by the blood of Christ” (Ephesians 2:13).

## Notes continued:

Our sins are washed off and we are made new – just as if we have never sinned before! We are free from the guilt and condemnation of sin. We are justified. The label and stain of sin on us is exchanged for the label of righteousness with God. Wow! We can feel really clean on the inside knowing and believing the following great promises from God.

Let us read these verses and think about what they mean for us today.

- “I, even I, am He who blots out your transgressions for My own sake; and I will not remember your sins” (Isaiah 43:25).
- “As far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us” (Psalm 103:12).
- “Come now, and let us reason together,” says the LORD, “though your sins are like scarlet, they shall be as white as snow; though they are red like crimson, they shall be as wool” (Isaiah 1:18).
- “Repent therefore and be converted, that your sins may be blotted out, so that times of refreshing may come from the presence of the Lord” (Acts 3:19).

When King David sinned against God, he felt really dirty on the inside. He longed to be clean. He knew he could not clean himself, so, he prayed, “Wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow” (Psalms 51:7). God heard him, forgave, and cleansed him.

Now, you have no reason to remain in guilt or sin, feeling sorry for yourself, feeling dirty on the inside. Jesus is here and ready to cleanse you from every sin that has stained you. No matter how little or big you feel your sin is, no matter how far away you think you are from God, He is ready to accept you back to Himself. In fact, He has been patiently waiting for you to come to Him. He is not going to judge or condemn you. He wants to make you clean on the inside.

When we confess our sins, God forgives and erases any memory of our sins. He does not remember our sins anymore. The blood of Jesus wipes away all our sins. Isn't that simply wonderful?

**Memorize:** 1 John 1:9 – If we confess our sins, He is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness.



**Questions:**

- What happens when we confess our sins?
- Mention other people in the bible who prayed for their sins to be forgiven. Did God forgive them?
- Read Psalm 103:12 and Isaiah 43:25. How do you feel about these words from God about you?



**Reminder:** Sin is like a stain. Only the blood of Jesus can clean the stain of sin.



**Say and repeat:** Only the blood of Jesus can wash away the stain of my sin.



**Let us pray:** Dear God, thank you because of the blood of Your Son, Jesus, that washes away the stain of my sin. Please forgive me Lord of every sin. Make me clean and fill me with your joy. I ask this in Jesus' name, amen!
